



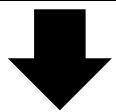
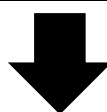
Curriculum Statement for PSHE

Intent – What we want to achieve

At William Austin Infant School, our mission is to create a learning environment 'Where All Individuals Shine'. Through our PSHE curriculum, we **intend** for our pupils to develop resilience, confidence, independence and healthy relationships in order to become responsible members of society. We believe by supporting our pupils with their personal, social and emotional development this will give them the confidence to tackle many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up.

Through our PSHE curriculum, we **intend** to ensure that our pupils view themselves positively and to be aware of their own personal skills and attributes. Our children will learn to appreciate the community they are part of and what it means to be a member of a diverse society.

Our PSHE curriculum is designed to develop the knowledge and skills needed to enable our children to be a global citizen. We **intend** to promote social, moral, cultural, mental and physical development that is relevant to our children.

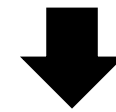
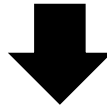
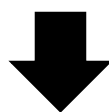


Implementation – How we will achieve this

At William Austin Infant School, we provide children with high-quality weekly PSHE lessons that are creative, engaging and inclusive. Key skills are taught and developed in carefully planned lessons. Each year group follow their own PSHE curriculum overview in which prior knowledge and skills are revisited whilst continuing to further develop knowledge.

Our PSHE curriculum is **implemented** through clear schemes of work which support children in mastering the National Curriculum objectives. The key themes in the SEAL programme, (New Beginnings, Getting On and Falling Out, Going for Goals, Say No to Bullying, Good to Be Me, Relationships, Changes) are used to enhance the PSHE curriculum. Our PSHE curriculum links to Computing in relation to online safety and Values Education in relation to the teaching and learning of the British Values of Democracy, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty and Respect and Tolerance.

From Summer Term 2021, our PSHE curriculum has incorporated Relationships and Health Education. The school uses resources from the Christopher Winter Project that have been approved by the PSHE association and the Local Authority. The resources are adapted to suit the needs of our children. Through RHE, children learn about healthy relationships and to accept differences.



Impact – The Outcomes

The **impact** of our PSHE curriculum is seen through children's increased understanding and acceptance of differences in the wider world. Children develop an understanding of what they are learning and how difference within society is positive. The **impact** of our PSHE curriculum can be seen through the children's understanding and application of the British Values and through the positive relationships they develop and sustain. Through their learning, children develop an increased self-esteem and feeling of self-worth. The **impact** of this is that children are confident in talking about differences between themselves and others and they can appreciate the positive effect that differences have on society.
