Key Vocabulary	
<b>sight</b>	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
<b>hearing</b>	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are.
<b>touch</b>	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!
<b>taste</b>	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet. You might have some tastes you like and some you don't.
<b>smell</b>	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.



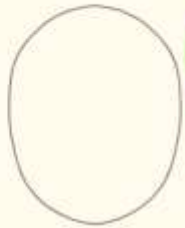
Labels for the girl's body parts:

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 1



Draw a faint oval. You will go back over this later after you have drawn the hair.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 2



Make some very faint guide lines with a pencil and ruler.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 3



Draw the eyes.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 4



Draw the nose.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 5



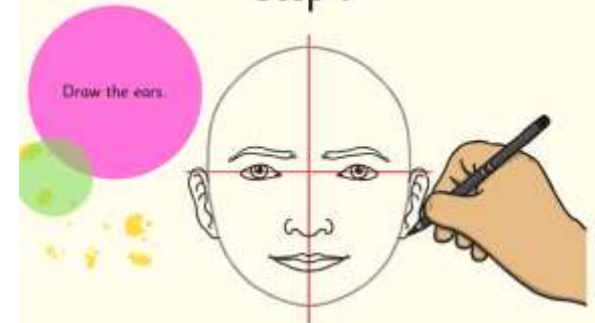
Draw the mouth.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 6



Draw the eyebrows.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 7



Draw the ears.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 8



Draw the hair.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 9



Go over the lines of the oval that isn't covered by hair. Erase the faint guide lines and the oval lines that are covered by hair.

### How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 10



Colour in the face. Don't forget to add the pupils in the eyes and any freckles or other details on the face.
