The responses to the survey showed that, overall, most parents and carers have a positive view of the school. Where families replied 'Don't Know', for example to the statement about bullying, we have assumed that this is because their family has had no experience of it. Very often, what one family thought we could do better, another thought we did well!

The 1 parent that would not recommend us to other parents also ticked the 'Disagree' box on questions 1, 3, 4 and 11, and 'Don't Know' on questions 8 and 10. On questions 2, 5, 6, 7 and 9 the same parent ticked 'Agree'.

What parents and carers think needs to improve.

From the 7 comments made about things we could do better,

- 2 wanted more information on their child's progress
- 1 was about homework
- 1 would like reading books changed more often, and another was about the amount of homework given
- 1 parent felt we held too many non-uniform days, and wanted parents evening in Autumn term to be held in Dec
- 1 parent felt that authorised absence, such as Eid and authorised leave of absence, should not affect their child's attendance percentage,
- The parent who would not recommend us to other parents was concerned that the teachers were 'too busy' to push students further, and felt that when children reach an adequate stage it is left to the parents to improve their child's abilities

What Parents and Carers think we do well

Of the 21 comments received, 3 parents said they were pleased with the variety and quality of workshops and assemblies offered to Parents. 5 commented that they were really happy with the progression their children had made, both socially and academically. 6 parents said how happy their children are at our school. 8 parents commented on the quality of the teachers, and how helpful the staff in school are.

'My child is happy and enjoys school, his reports and teachers comments indicates he is doing well, also his current teacher has always been helpful when required.'

'My child always coming home with a happy smiles on his face. He learn so much here in his time a fantastic school with great teachers who helped my child'.

'The school is organised well and all staff are trained to do their job efficiently. I am glad my daughter attends a reputable school. Also the idea of weekly attendance gift is a great idea! So is reading challenge'.

The reason why there are some gaps on my questionnaire is that my child is new to the school. However the school has made him feel very welcomed and he is really enjoying his new class and new teacher. I am happy with how he has been made to feel at ease.

I'm happy with the school policies regarding health and safety and the effort the school spent in equipment and quality in teaching.
