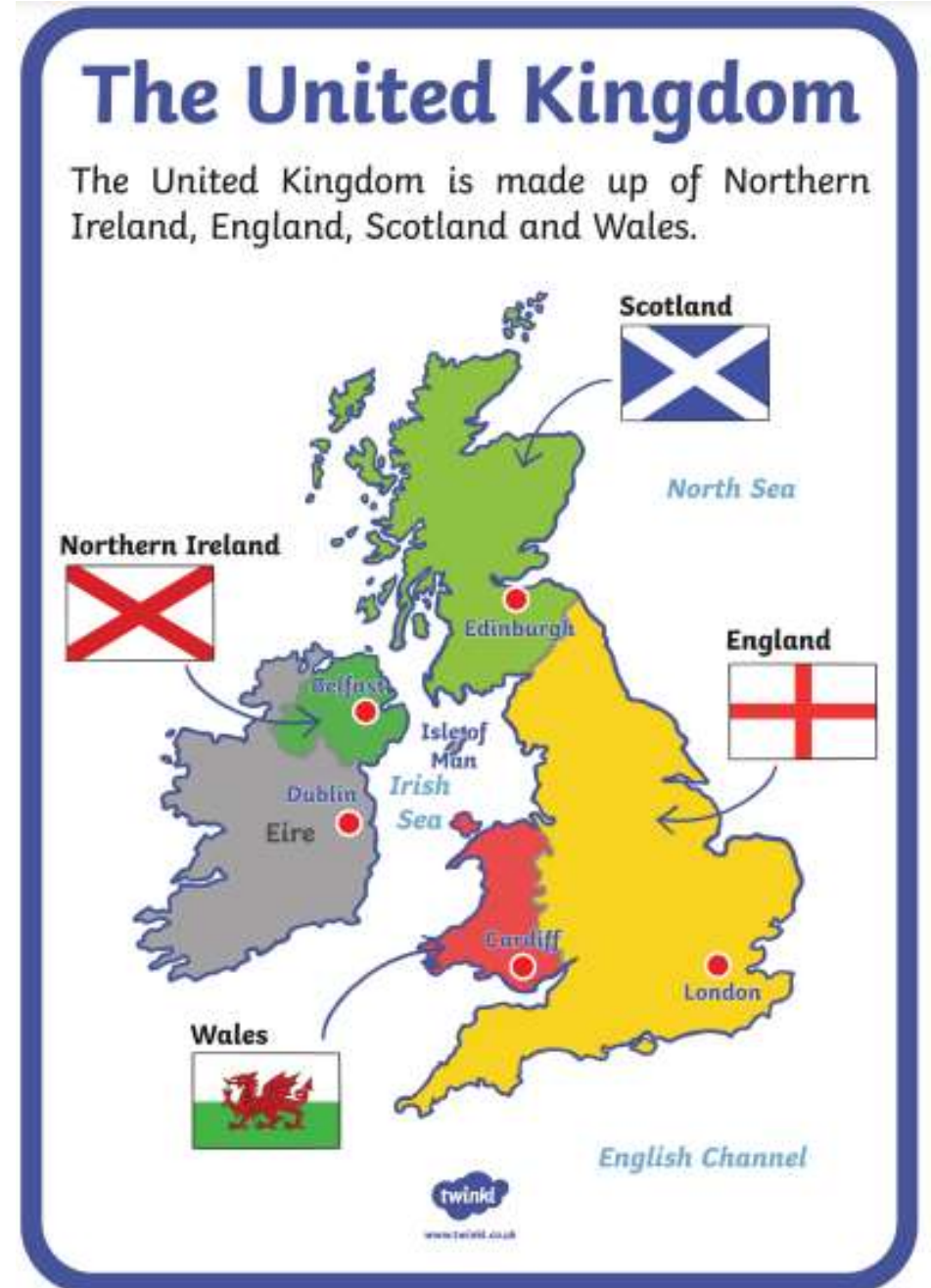






## UK Knowledge Organiser

Key vocabulary	Explanation
<b>town</b>	A town is a place where people live and work. There may be shops, places of worship, leisure facilities and schools there. It is bigger than a village but smaller than a city.
<b>countryside</b>	Land that is not in towns or cities. The countryside has lots of farmland and often woodland.
<b>Country</b>	An area of land with its own government, rules and borders.
<b>UK</b>	The United Kingdom. It is made up of four countries: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
<b>island</b>	An area of land surrounded by water.
<b>capital city</b>	The place where the government sits.
<b>landmark</b>	An object from a place that is easily recognisable. This could be a human or physical feature. Big Ben is a landmark in London.
<b>human feature</b>	An object that was made and built by people, such as Buckingham Palace.
<b>Physical feature</b>	An object that occurred naturally, like The Thames
<b>population</b>	How many people live in one particular place. This could be the population of a city, a town, a country or the whole world.
