













































Animals Knowledge Organiser

Key vocabulary	Explanation
Classify	To sort things into groups.
Identify	To notice differences between things.
Warm blooded	Animals that can make their own body heat.
Cold blooded	Animals that become hotter and colder depending on the temperature outside.
Scales, fins, gills	Some animals have scales to protect their skin. Fins are used to swim through water. Gills are used to breathe under water.
Diet	The food and water that an animal needs.
Carnivores	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat).
Herbivores	Animals that mostly eat plants.
Omnivores	Animals that eat both plants and other animals (meat).

Animal	Eat
Carnivore 	These are animals that eat other animals (meat). 
Herbivore 	These are animals that only eat plants. 
Omnivore 	These are animals that eat other animals (meat) and plants.

 <u>Amphibians</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cold blooded. • Moist skin and webbed feet. • Live in water and on land. • Lay eggs. 	
 <u>Fish</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cold blooded • Live in water. • Have fins to move and gills to breathe. • Lay eggs in water. 	
 <u>Birds</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Warm blooded. • Have feathers, wings and a beak. • Lay eggs. 	
 <u>Reptiles</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cold blooded • Have scales, ear holes and dry skin. • Lay eggs. 	
 <u>Mammals</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Warm blooded. • Have fur or hair • Gives birth to live young who drink their mother's milk.
